1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The interim financial statements have been prepared for the six month period from 25 January 2009 to 25 July 2009. The comparative period shown in the interim financial statements is from 27 January 2008 to 26 July 2008. The accounting policies applied are consistent with those applied in the preparation of the statutory financial statements. These interim financial statements do not constitute statutory accounts, and are unaudited.

1.2 Accounting convention

The interim financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

1.3 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

1.4 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

1.5 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life of 10 years

Goodwill is reviewed annually for indications of impairment as described in the tangible fixed asset accounting policy set out below.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Buildings	75 years straight line
Long Leasehold	Over the term of the lease
Fixtures, fittings and equipment	10-20% straight line

Freehold land is not depreciated.

The directors assess assets or group of assets for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value of an asset may not be recoverable. Assets are grouped into individual cash generating units which are assessed separately. Impairment occurs where the recoverable amount of the asset is less than its carrying amount. Recoverable amount is the higher of an assets net realisable value less costs to sell and its value in use. Any impairment loss is treated as a charge through the profit and loss account.

1.7 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

1.8 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.9 Taxation

The interim financial statements do not include a provision for current taxation in respect of the period ended 25 July 2009 (period ended 26 July 2008 – NIL).

1 Accounting policies (continued)

1.10 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at appropriate rates on all timing differences using the liability method only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallize in the foreseeable future
